Course Description: The term “sundowning” is commonly used to refer to the increase in challenging situations that occur with people living with dementia in the later afternoon and evening hours. In this session, Teepa will explain how brain changes contribute to these behaviors and situations. Attendees will also learn how to distinguish behaviors and situations that are truly causing or signaling distress versus those that may be able to be ‘let go.’ Teepa will introduce six factors that can be used to assess and resolve these situations as well as essential supportive communication strategies.
